## Closed Syllable

1 This syllable can only have one vowel.
2 The vowel is followed by one or more consonants (closed in).

3 The vowel sound is short, marked with a breve ( ${ }^{-}$).
4 This syllable can be combined with other syllables to make multisyllabic words.

## Examples

Mark-up Sample
up hat ship last

## Vowel-Consonant-e Syllable

1 This syllable has a vowel, then a consonant, then an $\mathbf{e}$.

2 The first vowel has a long sound, marked with a macron ( ${ }^{-}$).
3 The $\mathbf{e}$ is silent.
4 This syllable can be combined with other syllables to make multisyllabic words.

## Open Syllable

1 This syllable has only one vowel which is the last letter in the syllable.

2 The vowel sound is long, marked with a macron $\left(^{-}\right)$.

3 This syllable can be combined with other syllables to make multisyllabic words.

## Examples <br> Mark-up Sample

## Consonant-le Syllable

1 This syllable has only three letters: a consonant, an 1 , and an $\mathbf{e}$.

2 The $\mathbf{e}$ is silent. It is the vowel. Every syllable needs at least one vowel. The consonant and the $\mathbf{1}$ are sounded like a blend.

3 This syllable must be the last syllable in a multisyllabic word.

Examples
Mark-up Sample
cradle little bubble
$\frac{\text { bub }}{} \frac{\text { bl\&/ }}{-l e}$

## R-Controlled Syllable

1 This syllable contains a single vowel followed by an $\mathbf{r}$ ( $\mathbf{a r}, \mathbf{e r}, \mathbf{i r}, \mathbf{o r}, \mathbf{u r}$ ).
2 The vowel is neither long nor short; it is controlled by the $\mathbf{r}$.
3 This syllable can be combined with other syllables to make multisyllabic words.


## Double Vowel - "D" Syllable

1 This syllable contains a vowel digraph or a diphthong. These are vowel teams.
2 This syllable can be combined with other syllables to make multisyllabic words.
Vowel Digraph: Two vowels together that represent one sound (ee).

Diphthong: A sound that begins with one vowel sound and glides into another (oi).
